CARPE DIEM ARTE E PESQUISA (CDAP) est un centre dédié à l'art contemporain et à la recherche curatoriale, situé dans le Palais Pombal, un palais du XVIème siècle à Lisbonne. Depuis sa fondation par le commissaire d'exposition brésilien Paulo Reis en 2009, le CDAP a présenté de nombreuses expositions multidisciplinaires et des programmes au public qui ont dynamisé la vie culturelle lisboète.

En 2017, la KOGAN GALLERY et le Carpe Diem Arte e Pesquisa ont noué un partenariat, sur la base de valeurs et d'une vision du marché de l'art communes. Notre credo : l'art est créateur de lien social, il amène à une réflexion sur notre société, c'est pourquoi il doit s'adresser au plus grand nombre.

Le CDAP, qui s'est organisé pour que son établissement soit un réel tremplin pour des artistes en recherche de création et un lieu ouvert à tout public, s'autofinance en présentant et vendant un art exigeant mais accessible. Les oeuvres, des éditions limitées offertes par les artistes au centre CARPE DIEM à leur sortie de residences, sont aussi destinées à susciter l'intérêt de potentiels nouveaux collectionneurs d'art contemporain. Elles viennent mettre un point d'honneur à la logique du programme curatorial du centre d'art et se justifient comme étant leur modèle de durabilité et de continuité dans l'environnement culturel actuel.

Les oeuvres qui constituent la collection du CDAP seront donc présentées à la KOGAN GALLERY, ainsi que le mode original de fonctionnement du centre, au détour d'une conférence organisée par Lourenço Egreja, directeur et commissaire du centre CARPE DIEM , à la KOGAN GALLERY le 18 mars à 15h.















Manuel Caeiro was born in Evora (Portugal) in 1975. He is an artist whose career is recognized in Portugal and gradually recognized internationally. Carla Cabanas

Carla Cabanas (n. Lisboa, 1979) graduated in Visual Arts at Escola Superior de Artes e Design, Caldas da Rainha in 2003. She also concluded the advanced course at Escola Maumaus - Escola de Artes Visuais in 2004, in Lisboa. In 2008, she attended the photography course from the Gulbenkian Creativity and Artistic Creation Programme. In 2009 she concluded her postgraduation in Production and Creation in Technological Arts at Universidade Lusófona de Humanidades e Tecnologias, in Lisboa. Her work has been also developed through artistic residencies, including "MobileHome - Curso Experimental de Arte Contemporânea" at Lagar Portas do Céu, in Loulé, 2009; "Transitante: entre álbuns e arquivos", Workshop Internacional de Artistas no Intendente, Lisboa, 2012. "Viagens Invisiveis", São Tomé e Principe, 2013.

She won an Honorable Mention in Premio de Fotografia Purificacion Garcia in 2012 and in 2005 she won the third price of Pintura Ariane de Rothschild. In 2010/2011 she received a



scholarship from INOV-Art Programme from Portugal's Ministry of Culture, to live in Antwerp and be David Claerbout's assistant. Her work is present at Colecção Fundação PLMJ, Colecção BES ART, Banque Privée Edmond de Rothschild Europe, Colecção LPS (Stanislas y Leticia Poniatowski) and in several private collections. She exhibits regularly since 2000.

Eduarto Benamor Duarte

Licensed architect, designer and owner of the studio Benamor Duarte Architecture, based in New York City and Lisbon. Since 2011 he is an Assistant Professor at the Rhode Island School of Design, leading design studios and seminars in the Department of Interior Architecture. His work has been widely exhibited in Europe, namely at the Salone Satellite, SuperstudioPiu and MADE Expo in Milan; Institut National d'Architecture in Paris and Experimenta design Biennial in Lisbon and in Wanted Design in New York. Eduardo Benamor Duarte's design work has been featured in numerous prestigious magazines (AD France, Domus, Elle Décor, Ecologik, Interni, Icon, Vogue, Surface China and Space Magazine); television networks (RTP, RAI UNO) or press (Corriere della Sera, La Reppublica and Expresso). His work and research has been awarded by several institutions such as the Ministério da Cultura – Direcção Geral das Artes, Fundação Calouste Gulbenkian, Fundação para a Ciência e Tecnologia e Associação Empresarial Portuguesa (AEP).

before establishing his own practice in 2009. his experience have lead to work as an Associate Senior designer at the New York office of Skidmore Owings and Merrill LLP, In addition to his professional practice, he has taught architecture and design studios in the USA at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and California College of the Arts in San Francisco.. Eduardo Benamor Duarte holds a Master of Science in Advanced Architectural Design from Columbia University, and a Bachelor of Architecture and Urban Design from the Technical University of Lisbon.

Maria Condado

Born in 1981, Maria Condado lives and works in Lisbon. The artist graduated in Painting from FBAUL in 2004. In 2006 she participated in the workshop Intervir na paisagem directed by the sculptor Alberto Carneiro at Oficinas do Convento, Montemor-o-Novo. From her solo exhibitions stand out Trabalho de

Campo (2013) at Next Room, Ocidente (2012), Jardim Botânico (2009) and Promised Land (2007) at Caroline Pagès Gallery in Lisbon, and from her collective exhibitions the participation at the Portuguese Pavillion, Hangar-7, Salzburg, Austria (2009) and Vestigio at Hospital Júlio de Matos (2008). She was selected for the Anteciparte prize in Lisbon (2006) and the Ariane de Rothschild's Painting Prize also in Lisbon (2005). In 2011 Maria was invited to join Grupo RAR's collection and Ilustrate the Relatório e Contas-2010 with her work. Her work is also included in Fundação PLMJ's collection in Lisbon and other private collections in Portugal, France and Austria.

Inês Amado

Inês Amado, born in Leiria, Portugal is a London based artist, curator, academic and researcher. Her most recent work focuses on the exile, displacement, temporality, change and transformation, including the investigation of spaces of transit and of transition invoked by memory and storytelling that reveal cross cultural semiotic aspects as well as historical legacies. River Flows a major exhibition in Leiria Portugal in 2015/2016, focussed these aspects.

In 2014 she co-organized, co-curated and participated in the IV BreadMatters – Crossing Boundaries Intersecting The Grain in ARtos Nicosia, Cyprus. BreadMatters is a research program composed of exhibition and debate that questions and focuses on socio-cultural, political, historical and geographical issues around bread and the importance of bread in the history of humankind and which, brings together artists, art historians, writers, musicians, art



critics and the public in a program of exhibition and debate.

Inês Amado has a doctorate in Humanities – with a focus on Anthropology and Oral History.
